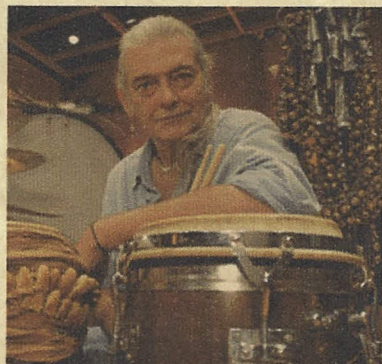

Northern California will once again have an opportunity to study hand drumming and percussion techniques with Jim Brock - a "drummers' drummer".

Jim Brock (part Cherokee) has proven to be an innovator in the world of drums and percussion. Within his forty five year career he has appeared on recordings with Joe Walsh, Joan Baez, Kathy Mattea, Joe Cocker, Janis Ian, River Phoenix, and James McMurtry.

With five solo recordings and a DVD entitled "The Nature of Drumming", Jim has traveled the world extensively with performances on "The Tonight Show", "A Prairie Home Companion", and multiple appearances on "The View", and "Good Morning America". Brock also performed at the White House for President Clinton in 2000.

Recently, Native American musician Mary Youngblood (Aleut and Seminole) along with Brock were asked to compose the music for the TV documentary "The Spirit of Sacajawea". For their work they received the prestigious Telly award, and were nominated for an Emmy in the category of Composer. Mary is a two-time Grammy award winner for Best Native American Music Album in 2002 and 2006.

Attendees will enjoy Brock's unique percussive style, inspired by Mother Earth. "Everything has rhythm," states Brock. "And everything around us is a natural symphony!" Mary will show attendees how the Native American flute can be implemented with percussion!

Bring your favorite percussion instruments if you'd like. There will be instruments available while you attend this two-hour workshop with The First Lady of the Flute and one of the World's finest percussionists!
